

Pain from an Adept Who Looked Back

As the one we have called Adelle passed through the challenges of her life, there were frequent opportunities for her to see the illusions that were being perpetuated by those around her. And, while she chose varying methods of escape to avoid these, ultimately she came to know them as just what they are: the manufacture of the collective mass-mind thought and the status quo of what you would call the victims of society and those things which are considered to be of importance and a value to be quested for. But the greater she made the effort to quest for these, the more evident — thanks to the information she was so uniquely involved in and knowing — she saw the illusionary aspects of these. Not judging but supporting others who were pursuing those goals endeared her to them and, yet, all the while, the strength of her love and compassion for others was fueled — see, *fueled* — and fortified by the fact that she knew them, these things, to be what they are: finite passages through experiences chosen by the souls who dwell in the Earth.

For her, the realization came very early on that those things that were quested after by many did not fit her Spirit, and she realized the greater and greater volume of her Spirit as the journey continued. Until such point as she realized her value was now to be of greater service beyond. And, so, she chose that pathway; not out of hardship, not out of duress, but out of a sense of joy, a sense of hopefulness that, *I can do the greater work now, in the Beyond, and so I shall.*

When one considers the aspects of what is called (quote) “suicide” (end quote) it is not to include this sort of choice, for this is not a suicidal act; it is a choice to depart the finite for the Infinite. Not out of pain, not out of suffering, but out of the realization that the greater Truth for them, for she, lays beyond.

And so now she journeys without any qualms of limitation, no fears, no habits, no victims, utterly Free because the choice is, as always offered to all souls, for Complete Freedom upon departure. Witness, then, so many find difficulty in accepting Complete Freedom. For one reason or another — they feel unworthy, they feel guilty, they feel some sense of longing for something that is outside of Complete Freedom — and, so, they journey to a half-way point, or a medium point, wherein they can satiate those desires, needs, whatever you would call them, until they are Complete, as Adelle is Complete.

We learned after she ended her incarnation that she did things like being the first to put money into a charitable startup, organizing a push to get bicycles into a few villages in Africa. She struggled with no longer wanting this incarnation yet fighting to survive it. She once dangled from a 13-story balcony for an hour while police and rescue were downstairs and in her apt trying to talk her in. But she had a vision, and came in on her own.
- Al and I knew she completed her “commission” well. She was 28 when she went Home to her Sisters.
